

Over one million Michigan households rely on private wells for their drinking water. Some of these wells are at risk from contamination by pesticides and nitrate. To address Protecting the Environment these risks, the MAEAP Water Stewardship

Bring them to the Baldwin site between 9:00 am & 12:00 noon or 1:00-3:00 pm. Call 757-3708 x3 for more information. Forms and sample bottles are available at these sites prior to the drop-off day, but special bottles are not required. Any small clean jar will work and only one ounce of water is needed. The form can be filled out during drop-off. If you live in Manistee or Oceana Counties call for their local drop-off dates.

Michigan Agricultural Environmental Assurance Program (MAEAP) Notes

On February 12, 2013 the local MAEAP technicians held a Phase 1 educational meeting at the Methodist Church in Hart, Michigan. The meeting was arranged by technicians Lynda Herremans, Murray Stall and Jordan DeVries and it was attended by 81 persons. A variety of topics were presented by MAEAP verifiers, Conservation District representatives, MSU Extension experts, Natural Resources Conservation Service District Conservationist, Local Emergency Planning Committee Directors and Food Hub members.

To become MAEAP verified a producer must complete three phases of MAEAP which are education, risk assessment, and third party verification. This meeting qualified producers for the educational portion of the program.

Cristina Curell from the Lake County MSU Ext. discussed irrigation scheduling, uniformity checks, water withdrawal permits, and the new wateruse reporting system. NRCS D.C.'s Mark Kelly and Seth Earl and Kathi Lerg of the Farm Service Agency explained the USDA programs cost-share which include EQIP, WHIP, and CSP. Phil Tocco from Jackson Co. MSU presented the group with information about the new Food Safety Modernization Act and general food safety issues for small producers and farm markets. Scott King from the Michigan Department of Agriculture Rural Development (MDARD), PPPM Division discussed the need for producers to develop accurate pesticide

drift management plans and to keep them up to date. Liz Reimink and Tom Osborn from the Local Emergency Planning Commissions explained to the group the need for farmers to develop emergency plans for their farms and to share this information with local emergency responders. Dan Busby MDARD, a third party verifier for MAEAP explained the program, its requirements, benefits, and process for farmers to become verified in one or all three systems. The three systems are Farmstead, Cropping, and Livestock. Farmers from Manistee, Mason, and Oceana counties attended this very informative meeting.
